7. DCHC MPO Wildlife Crossing Planning Study (20 minutes) [24-183](#)**David Miller, MPO Staff****Madeline Galliano, MPO Staff**

The Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHC MPO) began developing a wildlife crossing plan for its planning area in early 2024 as part of its safety planning efforts. With guidance from a Core Technical Team of MPO members and stakeholders, MPO staff are leading this study to identify transportation improvements at wildlife crossing hotspots in the MPO area to help eliminate wildlife-vehicle crashes while also protecting the natural environment and promoting wildlife connectivity. A presentation will be provided on the MPO's planning process and draft plan.

On February 27, 2024, the DCHC MPO Board approved the revised Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization Methodology for Identifying and Ranking New Transportation Improvement Program Project Requests, which was subsequently approved by the North Carolina Department of Transportation on March 1, 2024. The approved methodology is provided in the attachments for reference. The approved methodology directs DCHC MPO staff to apply certain criteria to all Regional and Division projects (and Statewide projects that cascade to the Regional level) as an initial determination of which projects should receive local points during the Statewide Prioritization Process.

The project ranking for the Division Needs projects requires the allocations of the Regional Impact projects to be complete prior to being released for public comment in order to score the Regional Impact projects that will be cascading to the Division level. The current timeline for adoption is as follows:

- October 8: TC recommends Board release for public comment
- October 22: Board release for public comment
- November 8: TC recommends Board approves LIP assignment
- November 19: Board approves LIP assignment
- November 29: LIP due to SPOT Office

MPO Staff will provide a regular update to members on Destination 2055, the joint Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro MPO and Capital Area MPO Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) at each meeting until the MTP is adopted (expected early 2026).
