ACTION ITEMS

6. 2025 Update to the ADA Transition Plan

Monet Moore, Principal Planner

Monet Moore, Principal Planner, presented the 2025 ADA Transition Plan update. She reviewed the legal framework (Section 504, ADA Title II), the 2017 plan, and the recent how the TPO held an ADA Focus Group in partnership with the Triangle Disability Awareness Council. The group identified regional barriers and proposed improvements in transit stops, pedestrian infrastructure, communications, and staff training. The draft plan includes updated grievance procedures, accessibility audits of MPO facilities, and outreach strategies and a set of recommendations to improve transit and bike/ped accessibility throughout the region. The TPO has brought on braille and ASL service providers as vendors.

Ellen Beckman moved to release the ADA Transition Plan for a 30-day public comment period. The motion was seconded by Thahn Schado. The motion passed unanimously.

7. 2025 Update to the Language Action Plan Lucia Ciro, Transportation Planning Intern

Lucia Ciro, TPO Intern, presented the updated Language Access Plan. The plan expands beyond Spanish to include Chinese, ASL, and Braille. The decision to rename the document from a "Limited English-Proficiency Plan" to the "Language Access Plan" was explained. Legal foundations for this plan include Title VI, Executive Orders 13166 and

14224, and DOJ guidance. A four-factor analysis identified Spanish and Chinese as Safe Harbor languages. Key components include translated summaries of vital documents, staff training, the creation of "I speak cards" for public engagement. Paul Black noted that "safe harbor" is a term that originated with HUD not DOT and that he was surprised to see no south Asian language groups met the threshold. Motion to release the draft Language Access Plan for a 45-day public comment period was made and passed unanimously.

Paul Black moved to release the LAP Plan for a 30-day public comment period. The motion was seconded by Thahn Schado. The motion passed unanimously.

8. Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Amendment: Massey Chapel Road Bill Judge, City of Durham Earl Lewllyn, Kimley-Horn and Associates

As Kimley Horn was not in attendance, Bill Judge (City of Durham) presented the proposed amendment to the CTP realignment of Massie Chapel Road. Bill explained that the public comment period resulted in 8 comments with public reception being mixed. The proposal has introduced some confusion about the proposal's timeline. Bill explained that he does not have a recommendation for the board. Committee members discussed three options:

- 1. Deny the amendment and retain the current CTP alignment.
- 2. Approve the amendment as requested.

3. Removing the existing CTP alignment.

Ellen Beckman asked if option three had any impact on the traffic signals on Fayetteville, committee members discussed the long-term constructability of the proposed update and the existing CTP realignment with members doubting that either the city or state would prioritize building it. David Rooker, owner of the impacted daycare explained that the existing alignment would run through his daycares pickup and drop off lines and supported the amendment. The TC agreed to seek NCDOT feedback and decide whether to reopen the public comment period in the future with Aaron Cain noting that City of Durham had not received an application from the developer and the timeline for it would mean that a 3 month delay from the TPO would not impact Kimley-Horns client. The city and TPO will coordinate with NCDOT's TPD and John Sandor in Division 5.

Aaron Cain moved to postpone the CTP amendment, Paul Black seconded the motion.

The motion passed unanimously.

9. MTP: Preferred Scenario

Yanping presented the 2055 MTP Draft Preferred Scenario, based primarily on the "shared leadership" scenario it includes \$22 billion in total investments split across highway, transit and bike and pedestrian projects. The TPO held meetings with stakeholders and the comments and suggestions they received are being incorporated into the preferred option ahead of the model run. Yanping presented the project lists for ITS, highway and fixed guideway transit, impacts on congestion, travel time, VMT, and transit ridership and crowdedness metrics. Matt Day explained that the financial model was developed using proposed project costs and adjusting for inflation rates

along with revenue estimates and assumptions about changes to state, federal and local funding streams. One assumption, the proposed half cent sale tax would require general assembly approval. Doug noted that the financial plan is highly speculative.

Ben Berolzheimer noted that Chapel-Hill would like to remove Danzinger drive from the model due to recently approved development in the area. Matt Day noted that a project on 15-501 in Chatham County is a SPOT project and shouldn't be removed from the MTP unless the TPO also wants to pull the project from the SPOT carryover lists.

Paul Black moved to release the MTP Preferred option for a 45-day public comment period, Curtis Scapignato seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

10. 2026–2035 TIP Adoption and AQ Conformity Filmon Fishastion, Transportation Planner

Filmon presented the draft TIP and Air Quality Conformity Report. The air quality conformity report demonstrates that transportation sector pollutant emissions won't exceed a certain level. It's needed due to the TIP and MTP adoptions. The MTIP is a subset of the approved STIP, it's consistent with the 2050 MTP and first 4 years of the STIP. Filmon went over the adoption schedule including the public hearing at the August board meeting and the amendment schedule. STIP amendments happen after TPO MTIP amendments.

Paul Black made a Motion to recommend the Fy2026-Fy2035 MTIP and AQ-CDR for Board approval. The motion was seconded by Matt Day. The motion passed unanimously.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS: 165 11. Spot Process Updates 166 Filmon Fishastion, Transportation Planner 167 Filmon reviewed updates to the SPOT 8 candidate list, including additions and 168 removals based on stakeholder feedback. Members were reminded to submit project 169 data by August 22. Filmon outlined new express design requirements for highway 170 projects in SPOT 9. Nine express designs are available, with NCDOT Feasibility Studies 171 Unit doing the work. The express designs will be done in phases with the TPO needing to 172 submit the first 3 in November starting with the highest scoring projects. The TPO can 173 174 conduct its own express designs if needed. 175 176 12. Call for Projects Schedule Announcement Filmon Fishastion, Transportation Planner 177 Filmon reviewed funding allocations, project caps, and submission timelines. FY 178 179 2027 will prioritize shortfall funding for existing projects; FY 2028 will accept new proposals. Training is scheduled for November 16.
